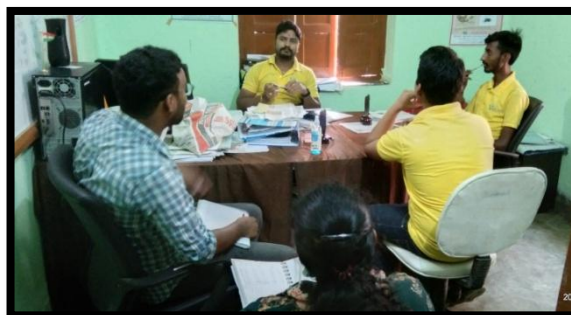




ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

Blood Donation

Under the banner of this club Jharkhand Swabhiman is motivating youngsters to come forward and start donating blood to someone in need. Over the past few years this effort of ours has yield benifits and several youngsters have joined us to serve this noble cause.

It's due to these youngsters that we have the hope that every requirement of blood to needy can be fulfilled. We would also like to thank all the donors who came forward voluntarily and donated blood.

Health Camps

Jharkhand Swabhiman has also conducted health camps for various community members.



Covid-19 food distribution:

One of the biggest pandemic that shook entire world was COVID-19. The virus has effected millions and lead to death of thousands. The number is increasing every day and the fear is that it would be one of the biggest epidemic of whole time.

Jharkhand Swabhiman with its limited resources tried best to reach the person in need of food during lockdown. We started with distribution of dry ration to the daily workers. About 65 families were reached. **Jharkhand Swabhiman** also made arrangements at its office for cooked food for the people who did not have place to stay.



With the help of "Vrignayani Sewa Sansthan" a CBO, we distributed dry ration to approx 70 female sex workers of Ranchi city. We had also provided the municipal workers working in a



where our office is located with providing waters, soft drinks and cookies in order to appreciate their work as **Corona Warriors**.

Assisting people of Babupur Panchayat in Miranpur Panchayat of Pakur district in downloading **Aarogya Setu** App was a big task as we had to first make them understand the importance of having this app. Once people were convinced then only they downloaded the app. The Mukhiya of Babupur Panchayat was a big help in communicating with the locals and making them realise the importance of this app. Our Representative Mr. Jantu Soren had made over 100 people download this app. As the epidemic is not over we are continuing our efforts.

Self Employment Training Program



In the effort to reach all the needy women of Ranchi city, we have organized self employment training programs. Basically our focus of the training was to provide a platform or a basis of income to Female Sex Workers, so that they can stand by their own feet and earn enough money for their families. We also included their family members (females) in this program. We provided them the rough materials and tried our best to sell the products and avail them their working honorarium.

Training programs on HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention

Jharkhand Swabhiman has also conducted trainings for DL SA/MLV and ANM, Sahiya Sathi on HIV/AIDS Awareness and Prevention ACT 2017, and Elimination from Mother To Child Transmission of HIV. We have conducted training sessions in all CCs of 24 districts of Jharkhand.
